WILDWINGS JAGUAR TOUR: 28th August – 13th September 2010
SPECIES CHECKLIST
MAMMALS

Total species **41** excluding feral Cape Buffalo & Pigs, and any unidentified rodents and bats.

White-eared Opossum <i>Didelphys albiventris</i>	One at Araras on the second night spotlighting.
Grey Four-eyed Opossum <i>Philander opossum</i>	One on the first night spotlighting at Araras and another on the second night in a different area.
Southern Tamandua <i>Tamandua tetradactyla</i>	A quite strikingly marked individual was found close to the track whilst spotlighting on the eastern side of Araras on the first spotlighting session giving good views.
Giant Anteater <i>Myrmecophaga tridactyla</i>	Despite a massive wildfire which burnt a substantial area of the park at Canastra which unfortunately took many casualties we still managed to obtain some excellent views of this special animal. This included a couple of very close encounters with well marked individuals with a total of six on the first day and a further five the following day.
Forest (Brazilian) Rabbit <i>Sylvilagus brasiliensis</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Surprisingly no Brazilian Rabbits were seen at Caraca. ▪ A few were seen during spotlighting sessions at Araras and Pixaim arae on the Transpantaneira.
Guianan Squirrel <i>Sciurus aestuans</i>	8+ around the carpark at Caraca as normal.
Azara's Agouti <i>Dasyprocta azarai</i>	Regularly observed along the boardwalk at Araras on both days with up to six individuals.
Capybara <i>Hydrochaeris hydrochaeris</i>	Good numbers seen daily in the Pantanal, especially at Araras where they cruise the bar area.
Brazilian Guinea-Pig (Cavy) <i>Cavia aperea</i>	One in the vegetable garden at Caraca, one at Canastra and six at Porto Jofre in the log-pile.
Marsh Rat <i>Holochilus sciureus</i>	A juvenile Marsh Rat species found underneath a bridge on the Transpantaneira is suspected of being this species and is currently being followed up.

<p>Puma <i>Felis concolor</i></p> <p>Ocelot <i>Felis pardalis</i></p> <p>Margay <i>Felis weidii</i></p>	<p>Unbelievably, we found what appears to be the same female we saw back in early August close to the road within a hundred metres of Araras entrance. A superb encounter as she was discovered sat by one of the roadside pools watching us only twenty or so metres away.</p> <p>Good albeit short views of a large male at reasonably close range at the end of the airfield at Porto Jofre on the first night spotlighting there.</p> <p>One was found on the Transpantanaira south of Pixaim on the final spotlighting session. Although initially partially hidden behind vines, this extremely well marked cat exhibited the large feet and different head shape of this difficult species though the tail was difficult to judge but it did help when the cat started to climb.</p>
<p>Jaguar <i>Panthera onca</i></p>	<p>A superb first encounter involved a female that was found swimming in a narrow creek just in front of the boat before exploding up out of the water, clearing a sandbar and launching herself at a Capybara, which was equally adept at escape. We then watched her briefly, though at close range, as she watched us from the riverbank, not a bad first morning! A second Jaguar, again a female, an individual we had seen on the first tour was found out in the open on the riverbank whilst returning after dark. Undisturbed by the spotlight, this magnificent cat just lay there watching us whilst observers and photographers soaked up the experience. The following day we had another encounter with a female in the same area as the previous day, though she was on the hunt and kept moving along the bank making it difficult to tell if it was the same individual. Our final encounter was again whilst returning after dark when a mating pair were spotted lying alongside each other on the low riverbank. As much as anything, this encounter was all the better for the loud vocalisations that rang out into the night as the two animals retreated to the undergrowth. Four encounters involving at least four cats, another special experience for the Wildwings Jaguar tour.</p>
<p>Maned Wolf <i>Chrysocyon brachyurus</i></p>	<p>Considering the problems we had on the previous tour with this species, it came as quite a shock to discover one stood amongst the onions in the vegetable garden within an hour of arriving at the Monastery.</p> <p>Two Wolves individually visited the terrace at Caraca Monastery during both nights of our stay in this wonderful area. Unlike some previous visits, the first animal came in very early and continued to visit on a regular basis allowing incredibly close observation and experience. Some enjoyed further, more personal, perhaps individual encounters when most of the other monastery visitors had retired to bed.</p> <p>We were also extremely lucky in locating hunting wolves at Canastra NP on both days we visited the park. One was found wandering the hillside close to the source on the first morning. Superb views of a hunting individual around the 'coral' on the second afternoon was followed by another, probably the same individual as the previous day, again above the source. Neither of these animals appeared to be carrying radio transmitters.</p>
<p>Crab-eating Fox <i>Cerdocyon thous</i></p>	<p>Two were seen well on the first night's spotlighting at Araras followed by as many as twelve individuals the following night.</p> <p>Once again, a habituated individual came to the bar area at Pixaim and another six were seen whilst spotlighting the Transpantanaira in either direction of the lodge.</p>
<p>Neotropical River Otter <i>Lutra longicaudis</i></p>	<p>At least two, possibly three were seen extremely well under a bridge on the Transpantanaira as we were travelling down to Araras. One was seen crossing the Transpantanaira close to Jaguar Ecolodge and a further two were seen on the Pixaim River close to the Beira Rio.</p>

<p>Giant Otter <i>Pteronura brasiliensis</i></p>	<p>Great views of several family groups once again on this trip with six on the three brothers from Porto Jofre, seven on the Pixaim from the Beira Rio and odd encounters with smaller numbers including a solitary animal on the Transpantaneira. A good year.</p>
<p>South American Coati <i>Nasua nasua</i></p>	<p>At Araras, in the boardwalk area there were at least ten individuals on the first day and up to fifteen on the second day, offering some close views of this rather endearing and curious beast. Around eight individuals crossed the Transpantaneira in front of the vehicle just south of Araras whilst travelling to Porto Jofre. One was seen around the Beira Rio at Pixaim.</p>
<p>Crab-eating Raccoon <i>Procyon cancrivorous</i></p>	<p>Only a few individuals, perhaps due to the extremely dry conditions, though these were seen well. At least two on the first nights spotlighting from Arararas and one the following night. One north of Pixaim whilst spotlighting the Transpantaneira.</p>
<p>Lessser Fishing (Bulldog) Bat <i>Noctilio leporinus</i></p>	<p>Observed at Araras, where there is a roost in a hollow Fig tree, individuals 'fishing' the corridors. Observed on the Cuiaba whilst returning to Porto Jofre in the evenings, around Porto Jofre and from bridges on the Transpantaneira whilst spotlighting. Observed at the Beira Rio in the venings and on the river whilst returning.</p>
<p>Greater Fishing (Bulldog) Bat <i>Noctilio leporinus</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Seen along the rivers at Pixaim and Porto Jofre in large numbers and from several bridges while spotlighting along the Transpantaneira. ▪ Also found roosting in a different tree at Araras Ecolodge and watched as they took insects from the ground along the verandah at Araras and Pixaim.
<p>Long-nosed Bat <i>Rhynchonycteris naso</i></p>	<p>At least ten roosting under a bridge and tree trunks north of Arararas and a further twelve plus, south of Araras on the journey down to Jofre.</p>
<p>Common Long-tongued Bat <i>Glossophaga sorcina</i></p>	<p>A small cluster it seems at the abandoned building at Campo Jofre roosting away from the Seba's.</p>
<p>Black Myotis <i>Myotis nigricans</i></p>	<p>A sizeable roost with several small clusters in the roof of the chapel at Caraca. Bats coming out from roost early evening on both nights and feeding around the terrace were probably this species</p>
<p>(Seba's) Short-tailed Fruit Bat <i>Carollia perspicillata</i></p>	<p>Around twenty individuals roosting in a disused building at the IBAMA research station along Santa Isabel Road and also in the abandoned building at Campo Jofre.</p>
<p>Black-tailed Marmoset <i>Callithrix melanura</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Although allegedly due to be split as a separate species we will treat the marmosets seen in the Pantanal as Black-tailed Marmoset in line with Groves Primate Taxonomy for the time-being. ▪ Nine, close to the trail but awkward at Araras Ecolodge, making it difficult for some. ▪ Six in the forest, close to the Beira Rio at Pixaim.
<p>Buffy-headed Marmoset <i>Callithrix flaviceps</i></p>	<p>Very difficult once again with the animals remaining largely elusive and generally quiet. Two plus several heard close to the river at Caratinga.</p>
<p>Geoffroy's Marmoset <i>Callithrix geoffroyi</i></p>	<p>Seven individuals came in to observe us in private forest at Situ Graciema, always a wonderful experience.</p>
<p>Black-tufted Marmoset <i>Callithrix penicillata</i></p>	<p>Surprisingly, only one followed by two the following morning were seen at Caraca, a poor result compared with the earlier tour. At least six on a private reserve at Canastra.</p>

Black-striped Capuchin <i>Cebus libidinosus</i>	Good numbers on this tour with some close observations and some interesting behaviour. At least twenty around the boardwalk at Araras were the largest group. Groups were also seen along the Transpantaneira, from the boat at Porto Jofre and around Pixaim.
Black Capuchin <i>Cebus nigritus</i>	Three groups were seen and photographed well at Caratinga Reserve.
Masked Titi (Monkey) <i>Callicebus personatus</i>	Excellent views of two along the Tanque Grande trail plus various vocalisations between the groups were heard throughout the site.
Northern Muriqui <i>Brachyteles hypoxanthus</i>	Fantastic views once again involving prolonged and close encounters with three groups during our visit to the Caratinga reserve.
Black (and Gold) Howler Monkey <i>Alouatta caraya</i>	A family of seven and a trio at Araras, two family's involving nine individuals from the boat out of Jofre on the first day and a further six the second day. Four close to the Beira Rio at Pixaim.
Brown Howler Monkey <i>Alouatta guariba</i>	Four family groups observed at Caratinga
Pampas Deer <i>Ozotoceros bezoarticus</i>	This is now an endangered species in Canastra so we were pleasantly surprised to find at least ten animals, especially considering the previous weeks horrendous bushfire.
Red Brocket <i>Mazama americana</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ One at Caraca during the daytime. ▪ One close to Araras whilst spotlighting. ▪ Two seen while spotlighting close to Porto Jofre. ▪ One close to the Beira Rio, Pixaim
Gray Brocket <i>Mazama gouazoubira</i>	Two close to the track opposite Araras Ecolodge on the second day.
Marsh Deer <i>Blastocerus dichotomus</i>	Observed regularly along the Transpantaneira from just north Araras to Porto Jofre with a maximum count of around twenty individuals. Bushfires along the Transpantaneira perhaps pushed this species close to the road.
Brazilian Tapir <i>Tapirus terrestris</i>	<p>One in marsh beside the Transpantaneira close to the Beira Rio whilst travelling to Porto Jofre, a nice daylight encounter.</p> <p>One alongside the airfield at Porto Jofre whilst spotlighting on the first night there.</p> <p>One on the riverbank whilst travelling back to Porto Jofre early evening.</p> <p>One close to the entrance at the Beira Rio, crossed the Transpantaneira whilst spotlighting with a further individual briefly glimpsed south of there.</p>

Ferals

Water Buffalo <i>Syncerus caffer</i>	Regularly noted around the river at Porto Jofre and Araras
Feral Pig <i>Sus domesticus</i>	Seen several times along the Transpantaneira and around Araras.

Miscellaneous Reptiles And Amphibians

Pantanal Caiman <i>Caiman yacare</i>	Incredibly Abundant in the Pantanal!
Common Iguana <i>Iguana iguana</i>	Regularly observed from the boats whilst travelling at both Pixaim and Porto Jofre
Common Tegu Lizard <i>Tupinambis teguixin</i>	Often observed dashing across the Transpantaneira, around Araras and the back of Jaguar Ecolodge.

Amazon Racerunner (Green Anieva) <i>Ameiva ameiva</i>	Observed at both Araras and Pixaim
Pantanal Swamp Turtle <i>Acanthochelys Macrocephala</i>	One was found in open country, 'rescued' as we hadn't seen one for years and released back to a suitable water hole.
Yellow Anaconda <i>Eunectes notaeus</i>	Fantastic views of a female just south of Campo Jofre
Black False Boa <i>Pseudoboa nigra</i>	One was caught by a Black-collared Hawk at Campo Jofre with struggle, a full-on-view
Yellow-tailed Cribo <i>Drymarchon corais</i>	A strikingly marked adult was observed escaping a Great Black Hawk before resting at the waters edge..

Several unidentified lizards, geckos, frogs and toads were also seen.

BIRDS

Nomenclature mostly follows **All The Birds of Brazil** (Souza)

Just over 320 species were seen, slightly higher than the usual total considering the main focus is on seeing mammals. I may have missed one or two species seen by participants during independent forays!
