Barred Buttonquail *Turnix suscitator* – One Hat Chao Samran area on 01/02.

Ferruginous Partridge *Caloperdix oculeus* – One on 03/02 KK

Bar-backed Hill Partridge *Arborophila brunneopectus* – At least six on the 03/02 KK

Red Junglefowl *Gallus gallus* – Small groups seen on both 02 & 03/02 KK

Kalij Pheasant *Lophura leucomelanos* – At least seven birds on 02/02 KK

Grey Peacock Pheasant *Polyplectron bicalcaratum* – One seen on 02/02 and Heard only 03/02 KK

Lesser Whistling Duck *Dendrocygna javanica* – 150+ on 01/02 WKT.

Little Grebe *Tachybaptus ruficollis* – Commonly seen around LPB and WKT.

Stripe-breasted Woodpecker *Dendrocopos atratus* – Two on 03/02 KK

Bamboo Woodpecker *Gecinulus viridis* – One on 03/02 KK

Rufous Piculet *Sasia abnormis* – Observed in the South.

White-browed Piculet *Sasia ochracea* – One on 03/02 KK

Buff-rumped Woodpecker *Meiglyptes tristis* – Observed in the South and on 03/02 KK

Black-and-Buff Woodpecker *Meiglyptes jugularis* – One on 02/03 KK

Greater Yellownape *Picus flavinucha* – Two on 03/02 KK

Crimson-winged Woodpecker *Picus puniceus* – Two on 03/02 KK

Streak-breasted Woodpecker *Picus viridanus* – Observed in the South

Grey-headed Woodpecker *Picus canus* – Singles observed on both 02 & 03/02 KK.

Common Flameback *Dinopium javanense* – A pair on 02 and 03/02 KK

Greater Flameback *Chrysocolaptes lucidus* – A pair on 03/02 KK

Rufous Woodpecker *Celeus brachyurus* – One on 03/02 KK.

Great Slaty Woodpecker *Mulleripicus pulverulentus* – Heard on 03/02 KK.

Great Barbet *Megalaima virens* – Several seen well on 02/02 KK

Green-eared Barbet *M. faiostricta* – Observed on both 02 & 03/02 KK

Blue-throated Barbet *M. asiatica* – Several seen well on 02/02 KK

Blue-eared Barbet *M. australis* - Observed on both 02 & 03/02 KK

Red-throated Barbet *M. mystacophanos* – Observed in the South
Coppersmith Barbet *M. haemacephala* – Observed both in the south and at KK.
Brown Barbet *Calorhamphus fuliginosus* – Observed in the South
Oriental Pied Hornbill *Anthracoceros albirostris* – Seen well at KK on both days.
Great Hornbill *Buceros bicornis* – Seen well at KK on both days.
Rusty-cheeked Hornbill *Anorrhinus tickelli* – Pair at a nest on 03/02 KK
Wreathed Hornbill *A. undulatus* – A pair at KK on 02/03
Scarlet-rumped Trogon *Harpactes duvaucelli* – Observed in the south.
Orange-breasted Trogon *H. oreskios* – Heard and seen at KK on 03/02
Red-headed Trogon *H. erythrocephalus* – A bird at KK on 02/02
Brown-winged Kingfisher *Halcyon amauroptera* – Observed in the south.
Common Kingfisher *Alcedo atthis* – Several around LPB/PK in the south.
Banded Kingfisher *Lacedo pulchella* – Observed in the south
White-throated Kingfisher *H. smyrnensis* – Observed in the south and regularly seen in the LPB/PK area.
Black-capped Kingfisher *H. pileata* - Observed in the south and regularly seen in the LPB/PK area.
Collared Kingfisher *Todirhamphus chloris* - Observed in the south and regularly seen in the LPB/PK area.

Blue-tailed Bee-eater *Merops philippinus* – Singles in the LPB/PK area.
Chestnut-headed Bee-eater *M. leschenaulti* – Observed in the South and around 50 birds at KK on 02/02.
Greater Coucal *Centropus sinensis* – Observed regularly throughout trip.
Banded Bay Cuckoo *Cacomantis sonnerati* – Observed in the South and at KK.
Violet Cuckoo *Chrysococcyx xanthorhynchus* – Observed in the South.
Drongo Cuckoo *Surniculus lugubris* – Observed in the South.
Asian Koel *Eudynamis scolopacea* – Recorded throughout the period.
Chestnut-bellied Malkoha *Phaenicophaeus sumatranus* – One on 03/02 KK
Green-billed Malkoha *Phaenicophaeus tristis* – Observed in KK on 03/02
Raffle's Malkoha *P. chlorophaeus* – Observed in the South
Red-billed Malkoha *P. javanicus* – Observed in the South
Chestnut-breasted Malkoha *P. curvirostris* - Observed in the South
Indian Roller *Coracias benghalensis* – Regularly seen on roadside wires close to LPB/PK
Vernal Hanging Parrot *Loriculus vernalis* – Several in KK on 02/02
Hoopoe *Upupa epops* – Observed close to LPB/PK on 01/02
Himalayan Swiftlet *Collocalia brevirostris* – Observed at KK on 02/02
Germain's Swiftlet *Collocalia germani* – Observed throughout the trip at all

localities.

Asian Palm Swift *Cypsiurus balasiensis* – Observed throughout the tour.

Cook's Swift *Apus cooki* – Observed in the South and at KK on 02/02

House Swift *A. nipalensis* – Breeding bird at our hotel in Hat Chao Samran.

Brown-backed Needletail *Hirundapus giganteus* – Observed at KK on 02/03.

Grey-rumped Treeswift *Hemiprocne longipennis* – Observed at KK on 02/03.

Barn Owl *Tyto alba* – One on the outskirts of KK on 03/02.

Asian Barred Owlet *Glaucidium cuculoides* – One pre-tour KK.

Oriental Scops Owl *Otus sunia* – Heard in LPB/PT area on 30/01 and KK on 03/02.

Collared Scops Owl *Otus bakkamoena* – Observed in the South.

Barred Eagle Owl *Bubo sumatranus* - Observed in the South.

Buffy Fish Owl *Ketupa ketupu* - Observed in the South.

Brown Wood Owl *Strix leptogrammica* - Observed in the South.

Gould's Frogmouth *Batrachostomus stellatus* – Observed in the South.

Blyth's Frogmouth *B. affinis* – Observed in the South.

Large-tailed Nightjar *C. macrurus* – Stunning views of a displaying pair at KK 02/03

Indian Nightjar *C. asiaticus* – A pair in the Kings Project LPB on 31/01

Rock (Feral) Pigeon *Columba livia* – Throughout.

Mountain Imperial Pigeon *Ducula badia* – Birds observed at KK on 02/02.

Spotted Dove *Streptopelia chinensis* – Commonly recorded around LPB/PK and elsewhere.

Red-collared Dove *S. tranquebarica* - Commonly recorded around LPB/PK.

Peaceful (Zebra) Dove *Geopelia striata* - Commonly recorded.

Orange-breasted Pigeon *Treron bibineta* – A single near WKT on 01/02

Thick-billed Green Pigeon *T. curvirostra* – Close observations of birds in a fruiting tree at KK on 03/02.

Wedge-tailed Green Pigeon *T. sphenura* – Several at KK on 02/02.

Emerald Dove *Chalcophaps indica* – Regularly observed in forest areas .

White-breasted Waterhen *Amaurornis phoenicurus* - Small numbers, Kings Project LPB

Watercock *Gallicrex cinerea* – Female, Kings Project 30/02

Common Moorhen *Gallicrex cinerea* - 2/3 at WKT/NPL area

Ruddy-breasted Crake *Porzana fusca* - Around six birds, Kings Project, LPB/PT.

Slaty-breasted Rail *Gallirallus striatus* - At least 2 in the Kings Project, LPB/PT.

Pintail Snipe *Gallinago stenura* - Regularly observed in Kings Project, LPB/PT.

Common Snipe *Gallinago gallinago* – Small numbers observed in the Kings Project LPB/PT.

Black-tailed Godwit *Limosa limosa* – Observed daily LPB/PT.

Asian Dowitcher *Limnodromus semipalmatus* – A group of 47 birds together LPB on 30/01

Whimbrel *Numenius phaeopus* – Small numbers on the mud flats and at the roosts in the South and LPB/PT.

Eurasian Curlew *Numenius arquata* - Good numbers on the mud flats, 250+ at the roost at Pak Thale on 31/02.

Far-eastern Curlew *Numenius madagascariensis* – One bird at least roosting with the Eurasian Curlew at Pak Thale pre-tour.

Bronze-winged Jacana *Metopidius indicus* – Several in stunning plumage in the WKT/NPL area 01/02.

Pheasant-tailed Jacana *Hydrophasianus chirugus* – Small numbers, in nonbreeding plumage around the WKT/NPL area on 01/02

Spotted Redshank *Tringa erythropus* - Commonly seen, often in good numbers in select and favoured areas around LPB/PT.

Common Redshank *Tringa totanus* – Small numbers observed close to Krabi Mangroves and around LPB/PT

Marsh Sandpiper *Tringa stagnatilis* - Commonly seen often in very good numbers in group feeding frenzies on suitable pools around LPB/PT.

Common Greenshank *Tringa nebularia* - Commonly seen.

Nordmann's Greenshank *Tringa guttifer* - Good views were obtained with a maximum count of around 40 birds together at LPB/PT on 31/01 and a few Krabi Mangroves area.



Wood Sandpiper *Tringa glareola* - Commonly seen, especially around Laem Pak Bia pans.

Terek Sandpiper *Xenus cinereus* – Observed in the South and around 40 birds at Pak Thale throughout.

Common Sandpiper *Actitis hypoleucos* - Small numbers throughout.

Ruddy Turnstone *Arenaria interpres* – Small numbers on the Krabi mudflats and around Pak Thale Salt pans.

Great Knot *Calidris tenuirostris* - At least 800 -1200 birds in Laem Pak Bia area.

Red Knot *Calidris canutus* - Probably around a forty birds intermixed with the main roosting flocks at Laem Pak Bia./Pak Thale

Ruff *Philomachus pugnax* - Fifteen to twenty birds in the general Laem Pak Bia area throughout the period.

Sanderling *Calidris alba* - Small numbers around the salt pans and a good roost at the sandpit.

Spoon-billed Sandpiper *Eurynorhynchus pygmeus* - We obviously regularly visit these birds and had excellent views during the period. With up to five birds occasionally together in the Pak Thale area, though usually two to three closely associating, it was a good period to observe them.

Red-necked Stint *Calidris ruficollis* - Commonly seen with occasional large flocks LPB/PT.

Long-toed Stint *Calidris subminuta* - Reasonably good numbers scattered

around the drier areas of the LPB/PT salt pans..

Curlew Sandpiper *Calidris ferruginea* – Common and in good numbers LPB/PT

Broad-billed Sandpiper *Limicola falcinellus* - Small groups throughout with some excellent views during the period LPB/PT

Red-necked Phalarope *Phalaropus lobatus* – At least 36 birds at Pak Thale throughout.

Black-winged Stilt *Himantopus himantopus* - Common

Pied Avocet *Recurvirostra avosetta* - A group of 52 birds around Laem Pak Bia often went missing in the vast area.

Oriental Pratincole *Glareola maldivarum* – One over the WKT/NPL area 01/02

Little Ringed Plover *Charadrius dubius* - Small numbers throughout LPB/PT area.

Kentish Plover *Charadrius alexandrinus* - Common throughout.

Swinhoe's Plover *Charadrius dealbatus* - Excellent view of both the male and female on the sandspit at Laem Pak Bia on 30/01.

Malaysian Plover *Charadrius peronii* –At least five pairs at Laem Pak Bia Sandspit, seen well on 30/01.

Lesser Sand Plover *Charadrius mongolus* – Good numbers, regularly seen often intermixed with their bigger cousins LPB/PT area.

Greater Sand Plover *Charadrius leschenaultii* - Good numbers, regularly seen often intermixed with their smaller cousins LPB/PT .

Pacific Golden Plover *Pluvialis fulva* - Again regularly recorded, often in good numbers in the drier areas LPB/PT area.

Grey Plover *Pluvialis squatarola* - Commonly recorded LPB/PT area Krabi.

Grey-headed Lapwing *Vanellus cinereus* – Three outside KK on 01/02.

Red-wattled lapwing *Vanellus indicus* - Observed daily LPB/PT area and KK on 02-03/02

Pomarine Skua *Stercorarius pomarinus* – An immature bird landing on rocks in front of our lunch tables at Hat Chao Samran on 01/02 was a surprise!

Black-tailed Gull *Larus crassirostris* – A first-winter at LPB/PT on 31/01.

Heuglin's Gull *Larus heuglini* – Three Laem Pak Bia sandspit 30/01.

Pallas's Gull *Larus ichthyaetus* – First winter Laem Pak Bia sandspit 30/01.

Brown-headed Gull *Larus brunnicephalus* – The common gull in the LPB/PT area.

Caspian Tern *Sterna caspia* - Good numbers present this year LPB/PT.

Lesser-crested Tern *Sterna bengalensis* – Observed around Krabi Mangroves.

Great-crested Tern *Sterna bergii* – Around ten birds observed at the roost off the Sandspit Laem Pak Bia on 30/01.

Common Tern *Sterna hirundo* - Commonly seen LPB/PT area and at Krabi .

Gull-billed Tern *Sterna nilotica* - Commonly seen LPB/PT area and Krabi.

Little Tern *Sterna albifrons* - Commonly seen LPB/PT area.

Whiskered Tern *Chlidonias hybridus* - Very common in the LPB/PT area.

Black Baza *Aviceda leuphotes* – Observed in the South.

Oriental Honey Buzzard *Pernis ptilorhynchus* – Several at KK on 02/03 and also observed in the South.

Black-eared Kite *Milvus migrans lineatus* – Around eight birds between WKT and inland at Norng Blah Lai on 01/02.

Brahminy Kite *Haliastur Indus* - Observed daily in the LPB/PT area and again at Krabi.

Pied Harrier *Circus melanoleucos* – One observed over the Norng Blah Lai area 01/02

Shikra *Accipiter badius* - One observed over the Norng Blah Lai area 01/02.

Japanese Sparrowhawk *Accipiter gularis* – One at KK on 02/03

Crested Goshawk *Accipiter trivirgatus* - A handful observed in Kaeng Krachan NP on both 02 & 03/02

Greater Spotted Eagle *Aquila clanga* – A single bird seen close to the Norng Blah Lai raptor watch area 01/02

Crested Serpent Eagle *Spilornis cheela* – Observed in the South and at KK on 02/02

Rufous-bellied Eagle *Hieraaetus kienerii* – One at KK on 02/03

Wallace's Hawk-eagle *Spizaetus nanus* – Observed in the South.

Black-shouldered Kite *Elanus caeruleus* - Observed in good numbers, unto 7 birds in the Norng Blah Lai raptor area 01/02.

Peregrine *Falco peregrinus* – One Bangkok 30/01.

Common Kestrel *F. tinnunculus* –Singles LPB/PT area throughout.

Indian Cormorant *Phalacrocorax fuscicollis* - Observed most days but always in much smaller numbers than the next species.

Little Cormorant *Phalacrocorax niger* - Commonly recorded

Little Egret *Egretta garzetta* - Common

Chinese Egret *Egretta eulophotes* – Two, Laem Pak Bia Sandspit 30/01

Pacific Reef Egret *Egretta sacra* – Observed regularly over lunch in the LPB/PT area .

Eastern Great Egret *Ardea alba modesta* - Regularly observed throughout the period.

Eastern Cattle Egret *Bulbulcus coromandus* - Commonly recorded in suitable habitat.

Grey Heron *Ardea cinerea* - Observed daily.

Purple Heron *Ardea purpurea* – Four in the WKT area 01/02

Chinese Pond Heron *Ardeola bacchus* – Small number seen in Kaeng Krachan where the similarly winter plumaged Javan does not occur.

Javan Pond Heron *Ardeola speciosa* - Probably the commonest heron in the LPB/PT area.

Black-crowned Night Heron *Nycticorax nycticorax* – A few seen in the LPB/PT area.

Little Heron *Butorides striatus* – Small numbers recorded in the LPB/PT area and in the South

Yellow Bittern *Ixobrychus sinensis* – Several near WKT/NPL area 01/02

Black-headed Ibis *Threskiornis melanocephalus* – Two near LPB/PT on 01/02.

Painted Stork *Mycteria leucocephala* – Small groups observed in the LPB/PT area.

Asian Openbill *Anastomus oscitans* - Invariably seen whilst driving from the airport in Bangkok toward the saltpans but also good numbers in the WKT area on 01/02.

Giant Pitta *Hydrornis caeruleus* – One heard calling twice at KK on 03/02.

Blue Pitta *Pitta cyanea* – One calling at Kaeng Krachan on 03/02 would not respond.

Malayan Banded Pitta *Pitta irena* - Stunning views of a pair at KNC.

Blue-winged Pitta *Pitta moluccensis* – One observed in the South
Mangrove Pitta *P. megarhyncha* – Great views of a calling bird at Krabi.

Black-and-Red Broadbill *Cymbirhynchus macrorhynchos* – Observed in the South.

Silver-breasted Broadbill *Serilophus lunatus* – Heard several times at KK on 03/02.

Banded Broadbill *Eurylaimus javanicus* – Observed in the South, Heard at KK on 03/02.

Black-and-yellow Broadbill *E. ochromatus* – Observed in the South.

Long-tailed Broadbill *Psarismomus dalhousiae* – Great views of at least four at KK on 02/02.

Greater Green Leafbird *Chloropsis sonnerati* – Observed in the South.

Lesser Green Leafbird *Chloropsis cyanopogon* – One at KF on 13/02

Blue-winged Leafbird *Chloropsis cochinchinensis* - Seen well at KK on both 02/02 and 03/02.

Asian Fairy Bluebird *Irena puella* - Commonly encountered at Kaeng Krachan.

Brown Shrike *Lanius cristatus* – Singles observed throughout the LPB/PT period and in the South.

Bay-backed Shrike *Lanius vittatus* – A first winter bird, the first record for Thailand was observed at the Kings Project on 31/02.

Black Drongo *Dicurus macrocerus* – Numerous in suitable habitat in the LPB/PT

area .

Ashy Drongo *Dicrurus leucocephaeus* – Regularly observed in the South and at KK on both days.

Crow-billed Drongo *D. aeneus* – Several at KK on 02/02.

Bronzed Drongo *D. aeneus* – Observed in the South and on both days at KK.

Hair-crested Drongo *D. hottentotus* – Regularly observed at KK.

Lesser Racket-tailed Drongo *D. remifer* – One at KK on 03/02

Greater Racket-tailed Drongo *D. paradiseus* – Several on both days at KK

Large-billed Crow *Corvus macrorhynchos* - Commonly seen in suitable habitat.

Crested Jay *Platylophus galericulatus* – Observed in the South.

Common Green Magpie *Cissa chinensis* – Observed on both days at KK.

Racket-tailed Treepie *Crypsirina temia* - A pair at the Kings Project. LPB 31/01 and at KK on 01/02.

Grey Treepie *Dendrocitta formosae* – Two at KK on 02/02

Black-naped Oriole *O. chinensis* - Singles at K on both days.

Maroon Oriole *Oriolus traillii* – Two at KK on 02/03

Black-winged Cuckooshrike *Coracina melaschistos* – Two at KK on 02/02

Ashy Minivet *P. divaricatus* – Observed in the South.

Scarlet Minivet *P. flammeus* – Several pairs at KK on 02/02

Bar-winged Flycatcher-shrike *Hemipus picots* – Observed on both days at KK.

Pied Fantail *Rhipidura javanica* – Common around the LPB/PT area .

Common Iora *Aegithina tiphia* – Observed in the South, in the LPB/PT area and at KK on 03/02.

Green Iora *A. viridissima* – Observed in the South.

Great Iora *A. lafresnayeri* – Observed in the South and at Kk on 03/02.

Black-naped Monarch *Hypothymis azurea* – Singles at Kaeng Krachan on 02/03.

Asian Paradise Flycatcher *Terpsiphone paradisea*- Observed in the South and both days at KK.

Maroon-breasted Philentoma *P. velatum* – Observed in the South.

Large Woodshrike *Tephrodornis gularis* – One KK on 03/02.

Common Woodshrike *T. pondicerianus* – Two at KK on 02/03.

Blue Rock Thrush *Monticola solitarius* – Observed in the South.

Orange-headed Thrush *Zoothera citrina* – Observed in the South.

Eye-browed Thrush *Turdus obscurus* – Around ten birds at KK on 03/02.

Naumann's Thrush *Turdus naumanni* – One with the latter species. A rare bird in Thailand, appeared to be the same individual found by Nick Upton and Nick Bray one week prior.

Dark-sided Flycatcher *Muscicapa sibirica* – Observed in the South and both days at KK.

Asian Brown Flycatcher *M. dauurica* – Observed in the South and both days at KK.

Red-throated Flycatcher *Ficedula albicilla* – A common wintering bird at KK

Chinese Blue Flycatcher *C. glaucicomans* – Observed in the South.

Hill Blue Flycatcher *C. banyumas* – One at KK on 02/03

Verditer Flycatcher *Eumyias thalassina* – Observed at KK on both days..

Grey-headed Canary Flycatcher *Cullicicapa ceylonensis* – Observed in the South and both days at KK.

Siberian Blue Robin *Luscinia cyane* – Observed in the South.

Oriental Magpie Robin *Copsychus saularis* – Common in suitable habitat throughout.

Siberian Stonechat *Saxicola maura* - Small numbers in the more suitable drier areas in the LPB/PT area and outside KK.

Ashy Woodswallow *Artamus fuscus* – One near NPL on 01/02.

Asian Pied Starling *Graupica contra* - Ever present at the Kings Project, singles elsewhere.

Common Myna *Acridotheres tristis* - Recorded daily, throughout period.

White-vented Myna *Acridotheres grandis* - Recorded daily.

Hill Myna *Gracula religiosa* – One KK on 02/02.

Asian House Martin *Delichon dasypus* – Three KK on 02/03.

Sand Martin *Riparia riparia* –Observed in the South.

Barn Swallow *Hirundo rustica* – Common throughout period.

Pacific Swallow *H. tahitica* – Observed in the South.

Black-headed Bulbul *Pycnonotus atriceps* – Small numbers KK on 03/02

Black-crested Bulbul *P. melanicterus* – Commonly observed at Kaeng Krachan

Stripe-throated Bulbul *P. finlaysoni* –Two at KK on 03/02.

Flavescent Bulbul *P. flavescens* – Observed at Kaeng Krachan on 02/02.

Streak-eared Bulbul *P. blandfordi* – Singles throughout LPB/PT period and KK on 03/02.

Red-eyed Bulbul *P. brunneus* – Observed in the South.

Grey-eyed Bulbul *Iole propinqua* – Observed at KK on 03/02.

Buff-vented Bulbul *I. Olivacea* –Observed in the South.

Ochraceous Bulbul *Alophoixus ochraceous* – Observed in the South and Common at KK

Grey-cheeked Bulbul *A. bres* – Observed in the South.

Mountain Bulbul *Hypsipetes mcclllandii* - One at Kaeng Krachan on 02/02.

Golden-bellied Gerygone *Gerygone sulphurea* - Observed relatively easily at the Kings Project, LPB and also in the South.

Zitting Cisticola *Cisticola juncidis* - Small numbers in the LPB/PT area.

Plain Prinia *Prinia inornata* – Singles in the LPB/PT area on both 07 & 08/02.

Dark-necked Tailorbird *Orthotomus atrogularis* – Observed at KK both days and in the South.

Ashy Tailorbird *O. ruficeps* –Observed in the South.

Black-browed Reed Warbler *Acrocephalus bistrigiceps* - Small numbers Kings Project and WKT area.

Oriental Reed Warbler *Acrocephalus orientalis* - A couple of wintering birds at the Kings Project were often difficult to observe this year, singles WKT area.

Thick-billed Warbler *Acrocephalus aedon* – One Hat Chao Samran on 31/01

Arctic Warbler *P. borealis* –Singles on both days at KK.

Pale-legged Leaf-warbler *P. tenellipes* – Two at KK on 03/02

Yellow-browed Warbler *P. inornatus* – Heard throughout, common at KK.

Claudia's Leaf-warbler *P. claudiae* – Singles in KK on both days.

White-tailed leaf-warbler *P. davisoni* – One KK on 02/03.

Sulphur-breasted Warbler *P. ricketti* – Singles on both days at KK.

Omei Warbler *Seicercus omeiensis* – One at KK on 03/02.

Yellow-bellied Warbler *Abroscopus superciliaris* – Four KK on 02/03

Lesser-necklaced Laughingthrush *Garrulus monileger* – A sizeable group at KK on 03/02

Greater Necklaced Laughingthrush *G. pectoralis* – Two at KK on 03/02.

Black-throated Laughingthrush *G. chinensis* – One KK on 03/02.

Short-tailed babbler *M. malaccensis* – Observed in the South.

Puff-throated Babbler *Pellomeum ruficeps* – Observed at KK on 03/02.

Black-capped Babbler *P. capistratum* – Observed in the South.

White-browed Scimitar Babbler *Pomatorhinus schisticeps* – Two at Kaeng Krachan on 02/02.

Ferruginous Babbler *Trichastoma bicolor* – Observed at KNC on both 11/02 and 12/02.

Moustached Babbler *Malacopteron magnirostre* – Observed at KNC on 12/02 and Krunching 13/02.

Scaly-crowned Babbler *M. cinereum* – Observed at Krunching Falls NP on 13/02.

Rufous-crowned Babbler *M. magnum* – Observed at KNC on 12/02

Striped Tit-babbler *Macronous gularis* – Observed at Kaeng Krachan on 02/02

Fluffy-backed Tit-babbler *M. ptilosus* – Observed in the South.

Grey-headed Babbler *Stachyris poliocephala* – Observed in the South.

Chestnut-winged Babbler *S. erythroptera* – Observed in the South.

White-browed Shrike-babbler *Pteruthius flaviscapis* – One briefly KK on 01/02.

White-bellied Yuhina *Yuhina zantholeuca* – Observed in the South.

Yellow-breasted Flowerpecker *Prionochilus maculates* – Observed in the South.

Crimson-breasted Flowerpecker *Prionochilu percussus*– Observed in the South.

Orange-bellied Flowerpecker *D. trigonostigma* – Birds regularly around the gardens at KNC.

Purple-naped Sunbird *Hypogramma hypogrammicum* - Observed in the South.

Plain Sunbird *Anthreptes simplex* – Observed in the South.

Brown-throated Sunbird *A. mallacensis* - Observed in both sections of the tour.

Purple-throated Sunbird *Nectarinia sperata* – Observed in the South.

Olive-backed Sunbird *Nectarinia jugularis* – Regularly observed close to human habitation and at KK.

Little Spiderhunter *Arachnothera longirostra* – Observed in the South.

Spectacled Spiderhunter *A. flavigaster* – Observed in the South.

Yellow-eared Spiderhunter *A. chrysogenys* – Observed in the South.

Grey-breasted Spiderhunter *A. affinis* – Observed in the South.

Streaked Spiderhunter *Arachnothera magna* – Several seen well at Kaeng Krachan on 01/02.

Paddyfield Pipit *Anthus ruffles* - Regularly observed during the tour in suitable habitat.

Indochinese Bushlark *Mirafra marionae* – Heard singing nr Laem Pak Bia.

Oriental Skylark *Alauda gulgula* - A few birds on the traditional patch behind the temple near Pak Thale

Eastern Yellow Wagtail *Motacilla tschutschensis* - Observed in small numbers in suitable habitat.

Grey Wagtail *Motacilla cinerea* – One KK on 02/02.

House Sparrow *Passer domesticus* – Observed regularly at the beginning of the tour.

Plain-backed Sparrow *Passer flaveolus* - A small number of this rather smart looking social sparrow were seen in the LPB/PT area.

Eurasian Tree Sparrow *Passer montanus* - Commonly recorded.

Streaked Weaver *Ploceus manyar* – Several in the WKT area on 01/02.

Scaly-breasted Munia *Lonchura punctulata* – Small numbers around the LPB/PT area.

MAMMALS

Lyle's Flying Fox *Pteropus lylei* - There is a very large roost in the mangroves at Laem Pak Bia.

Large Flying Fox *Pteropus vampyrus* – Good numbers leaving their daytime roost at Krunching .

Western Striped Squirrel *Tamiops mccllellandii* – Regularly observed at Kaeng Krachan.

Grey-bellied Squirrel *Callosciurus caniceps* – Singles at Kaeng Krachan

Black Giant Squirrel *Ratufa bicolor* – Observed at Kaeng Krachan and KNC.

Yellow-throated Martin *Martes flavigula* Single at Kaeng Krachan on 02/03.

Common Palm Civet *Paradoxurus hermaphroditus* – One Kaeng Krachan 02/03

Long-tailed Macaque *Macaca fascicularis* – 20+ observed near Ban Laem and Krabi.

Stump-tailed Macaque *M. arctoides* - At least 100 at Kaeng Krachan on 03/02.

Dusky Langur *Trachypithecus obscurus* – Observed regularly and in good numbers on both days at Kaeng Krachan.

Asian Elephant *Elaphas maximus* – One at Kaeng Krachan on 03/02.

REPTILES & AMPHIBIANS

Water Monitor *Varanus salvator* – Regularly seen at the Kings Project, also on the mangroves and sandspit at Laem Pak Bia.

Tokay Gecko *Gekko gekko* – Regularly heard in forested areas.

Spiny-tailed House Gecko *Hemidactylus frenatus* – This species it seems regularly around our various accommodations

Flat-tailed House Gecko *Cosymbotus platyurus* – The other numerous species in the various accommodations

Emma Gray's Forest Lizard *Calotes emma alticristatus* – One KK.

Malayan Giant Toad *Bufo asper* – Several around the bar area at Krunching on 12/02

FISH

Giant Mudskipper *Periophthalmodon schlosseri*. – Common around the mangroves at Laem Pak Bia.
